## **MESSAGE FROM CLUB PRESIDENT PAUL CUNHA**

Point West Rotarians:

As Point West Rotary celebrated 40 Years of Rotary Magic, our mission remained clear: raising funds, awarding grants, and serving with purpose. Thanks to the generosity of our members and the strength of our fundraising, we continue to build both immediate impact and longterm capacity.

This year's Rotary Golf Tournament raised \$17,000, including a \$5,000 grant given to Eagle Golf, while our signature

California Brewer's Festival netted more than \$60,000. Through these events, and through the generosity of our members and the magic of investment earnings, our Foundation remains strong and ready to meet future needs.

Our grants supported both longstanding partners and new organizations, reflecting the deep roots we've built in the Sacramento region and our openness to seeing our community in new ways. Internationally, we advanced projects in Uganda, Tanzania, and Africa while continuing to sponsor youth through Rotary's global programs, including our outbound exchange student, Owen Lennertz, who traveled to Denmark.

We invested in the next generation through the Partners in Leadership Conference, which engaged 33 Encina High School students, and through hands-on projects like the Salvation Army Playground, completed in partnership with American River Rotary.

And we celebrated fellowship — from creative weekly meetings to our 40th anniversary party, which brought together members old and new to honor our history and look ahead.

As we close this milestone year, I am grateful for the generosity, service, and spirit of our members, and of our Board of Directors, who are dedicated to ensuring that the Rotary Club of Point West remains the Best Damn Rotary Club on the Planet!

Together, we are writing the next chapter of Point West Rotary's legacy — a legacy of impact, connection, and enduring community.

### **GRANT SPOTLIGHT:** VIETNAM SCHOOL BATHROOM PROJECT

For the first time in 46 years, Rotary has a presence in Vietnam — and Point West Rotary is part of the story. In partnership with Cupertino Rotary, we helped fund the Vietnam School Bathroom **Project,** which is building and repairing bathrooms at three schools.

The project will impact 1,000 students, reducing the student-totoilet ratio from an astonishing **96:1 down to 32:1.** The change is especially meaningful for girls, who often miss class due to the lack of privacy and hygiene.

Point West contributed \$1,000, matched by District Designated Funds for a total of \$2,000, helping bring dignity, health, and opportunity to students who need it most.

This mission involves collaboration between the Foundation's Board, the Club's Board of Directors, and various committees, including the Grant Review and International Grant Committees.
